

Village Movement Coming to Gresham!

The Village Movement is coming to Gresham! The nationwide Village Movement is 25 years old. The first Village – Beacon Hill Village – started in Boston in 1999. UpRiver Village (www.uprivervillage.org) will support positive aging at home by providing socialization and extensive volunteer services to seniors in Gresham, Troutdale, Fairview and Wood Village.

UpRiver Village isn't a real estate development or a retirement community. Instead, members live in their own homes. They can be homeowners, renters, in shared housing, or living with relatives. The Village Movement embraces the strategy of bringing services to people rather than moving people to services. UpRiver Village will serve seniors within the city limits of Gresham, Troutdale, Fairview and Wood Village.

UpRiver Village will join Villages NW, a 501(c)3 not-for-profit organization with 13 existing and developing Villages in NW Oregon and SW Washington. UpRiver Village will also be a member of the national Village to Village network that includes over 500 existing and developing villages nationwide.

A core group of interested seniors is meeting monthly to work on organizational development. When that phase is complete, UpRiver Village will open for membership and start scheduling services.

UpRiver Village is building the foundation to provide practical services to members as well as opportunities for socializing. Volunteers will provide services such as transportation to appointments and shopping, occasional assistance with housekeeping and yard work, and help with technology. Social and recreational activities will include opportunities to meet like-minded seniors for coffees, book groups, potlucks, group walks, and more. Major Changes Coming to Medicare in 2025

You may have heard of some major changes Medicare is making regarding coverage of your Prescription Drug Plans that will go into effect in January of 2025.

Although this legislation was hailed as a move to lower the cost of prescription drugs for Medicare recipients, for many it may actually do just the opposite. The federal government is shifting the financial burden from Medicare onto the health plan companies that sell Medicare prescription drug plans and the pharmaceutical companies that manufacture our drugs. This transfer of cost will likely raise the costs of drugs on all Medicare Part D drug plans going forward.

We believe we can expect higher premiums (particularly with standalone drug plans), fewer plan choices, more restrictive formularies (what drugs will be covered), more drug utilization management (how much may be prescribed), and a reduction of some benefits in Medicare Advantage plans.

As soon as the Gresham Senior Center reopens this fall, we will again be holding educational classes where we will address your questions and assist you in going forward. Until the re-opening date is officially set, we would be happy to keep you updated as more information becomes available from the health plans as they navigate through these weighty changes.
